JULIAN ANTRAM AND NCWNP DISTRICT SUPPORTERS

Julian Antram, former CSM speech communication student, represented the Northern California Western Nevada Pacific District and won the National Japanese American Citizens' League's Min Yasui Oratorical Contest. The contest took place at the JACL's bienniel convention, which was held in Phoenix, Arizona. The theme of the oratorical contest was to describe what, if anything, could be done to strengthen Japanese American identity today.

The oratorical contest is named after Min Yasui, activist and defender of civil rights. After President Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066 on February 19, 1942, a curfew order was issued. Min Yasui filed a legal challenge against the order as a violation of the Constitution and went out after curfew to provoke arrest. He was sentenced to a year in prison, in solitary confinement, and stripped of his citizenship, which disbarred him from practicing law.

Julian is studying Communication Studies at San Francisco State University. He intends to participate in SFSU's study abroad program at Waseda University in Japan.

AT THE SAN MATEO COUNTY HISTORY MUSEUM

The San Mateo County History Museum, an organization San Mateo JACL has frequently collaborated with in the past, is announcing a historical triple crown . . . the opening of three new exhibits!

The first, "Land of Opportunity: The Immigrant Experience," encourages the viewer to explore the different ways in which immigrants have made a place for themselves in San Mateo County. In addition to the Japanese culture, Italian, Portuguese, Irish, Filipino, Mexican, and Chinese cultures are featured. There are stories of arriving in San Mateo, facing discrimination, defining roles, and maintaining culture. There will be multimedia, photographs, artifacts, and oral histories. You may record your feedback and share your family history in a unique "My Salon" station.

Other exhibits are "San Mateo County History Makers: Entrepreneurs Who Changed the World," which explores the lives of our finest local business minds who invented, revolutionized, and developed unique businesses that improved the lives of people in San Mateo County. The final exhibit in the "triple crown," is "Living the California Dream," which features a state-of-the-art 'object theater'—with a narrator tracing the evolution oif the California Dream using lighting effects on artifacts and video projection to add movement and drama. The museum is located at 750 Middlefield Road, Redwood City.

Dr. Yukio Tsuda will be a Fulbright Scholar in Residence at College of San Mateo for the entire spring semester of 2007.
